H.E. Mr. Suleiman J Al-Herbish - OFID Director-General

An Interview with OFID's Director-General Suleiman J Al-Herbish

Je would like to welcome at our Forum a distinguished guest and keynote-speaker, H.E. Mr. Suleiman Jasir Al-Herbish, who has been a very effective Director-General and CEO of the OFID (OPEC Fund for International Development) since 2003. H.E. Mr. Al-Herbish is known to be a supporter of people-centered development and has been very vocal on the issue of energy poverty alleviation, a cause that forms the central pillar of OFID's strategic plan. Under his leadership, OFID has offered massive financial aid, targeting mainly, the least developed countries.

Q Your organization has reached a remarkable status as an effective development institution. Please share with us your journey since inception.

A OFID is the development finance institution established by the Member States of OPEC in 1976 to provide support to developing countries. The organization works within the spirit of South-South cooperation alongside the international donor community to stimulate economic growth and alleviate poverty in developing countries.

Last year, OFID celebrated its 40th anniversary. During the four decades since our inception, we have undergone a remarkable transformation that is a real source of pride to all

involved. OFID has evolved from a temporary account with limited resources and ambitions into a pioneering international development finance institution of considerable substance, presence and influence. By the end of 2016, we had committed more than US\$20 billion in support of more than 3,600 development operations across 134 countries. Considering our modest size, this is an outstanding achievement.

It's been an extraordinary journey. There have been economic crises to navigate, geopolitical shifts, commodity price volatility, wars and natural disasters. But OFID has weathered every storm, repositioning itself to keep its work relevant and meaningful. This has involved embracing new financing instruments and building a more diverse partnership network. There's also been financial and operational restructuring, systems' modernization and institutional capacity building—all designed to ensure OFID remains a strong, modern and agile organization into the future.

Q Which areas / sectors do you cover and what are the requirements / criteria for project funding?

All developing countries, with the exception of OPEC Member Countries, are in principle eligible for OFID assistance. The least developed countries, however, are accorded the highest priority. For a project to be funded by OFID, it has to be a priority for the respective country, in addition being viable economically, socially and environmentally.

OFID provides financing to build essential infrastructure, strengthen social services delivery and promote productivity, competitiveness and trade. The organization's work is peoplecentered, focusing on projects that meet basic needs—such as food, energy, transport, clean water and sanitation, healthcare and education. OFID aims to encourage self-reliance and inspire hope for the future. Our main consideration is the social, economic, and environmental viability of a development project or program and its contribution to poverty alleviation and development in the Partner Country.

Concessionary financial assistance is extended for public sector operations in the form of loans. OFID also supports trade financing and finances private sector activities in developing countries. In addition, the organization provides grants in support of technical assistance, various aid projects, research and similar activities, and humanitarian relief. OFID also contributes to the resources of other development institutions whose work benefits developing countries.

In terms of sectors, OFID focuses on the energy-water-food nexus approach to sustainable development, which is furthered by our participation in the transport sector. This approach recognizes the dynamic and complex interlinkages between energy, water and food, and recognizes transport as an enabler. At the core of this approach is the belief that, as sectoral issues, energy, water and food cannot be considered in isolation from one another. Policies across these sectors must be aligned if we are to achieve sustainable development and

energy access for all. The nexus approach forms the central pillar of OFID's Corporate Plan 2016–2025.

OFID has assumed a lead role in global energy poverty alleviation efforts, following a direct mandate from its Member Countries in 2007. Working with like-minded partners, including the United Nations Sustainable Energy for All (SEforALL) initiative, OFID was instrumental in securing an explicit goal for energy in the UN's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The institution is committed to using all resources at its disposal and pursuing all viable solutions in a bid to make modern energy universally available.

The strategic framework for these activities is OFID's Energy for the Poor Initiative, which is funded through a revolving endowment of US\$1 billion, a sum pledged by the institution's supreme body, the Ministerial Council, in its June 2012 Declaration on Energy Poverty.

Q OFID often works as a catalyst for cooperative efforts in various development projects. It is unique in its range of projects and its commitments to ongoing

support. Could you please elaborate on the mechanism for project follow-up?

A We're conscious of the catalytic benefits to be gained from collaborating closely with like-minded institutions. Cooperation allows for mobilizing significant amounts of financial resources, manpower and skills, and helps avoid wasteful duplication of effort. The development challenges facing the world today can only be overcome if people, organizations and nations work together.

All public sector operations, for example, are co-financed with the Partner Countries and frequently with other donors, including regional development banks, and, in particular, the bilateral and development institutions of the Arab Coordination Group, which brings together 10 multilateral and bilateral financing institutions. In keeping with the principles of the Global Partnership for Effective Development Cooperation, OFID works with sister and other organizations to streamline joint efforts and procedures, and to maximize results.

Our projects are planned and implemented following a structure that ensures relevant information is constantly available so that informed decisions can be made at key stages.

Each project is designed to achieve maximum development impact in line with the 'Focus on Effectiveness' objective in OFID's Corporate Plan. More specifically, our Project Cycle details operational plans for beneficiary countries that outline goals, priority sectors, proposed action plans and programs, as well as issues, constraints and risks, and ways of mitigating them. Every project passes through the phases of identification, preparation and appraisal before it is submitted to the Governing Board for approval. Once approved, projects require signature and ratification to become effective; only then may disbursement begin. Public Sector project implementation takes place over several years. If a Private Sector or Trade Finance loan is involved, implementation is often quicker. Project completion generally reflects full loan

disbursement, at which point a Project Completion Report is produced.

Post Evaluation is a phase of paramount importance. It involves an in-depth analysis of the project and provides a realistic assessment of the contribution made toward a country's overall socio-economic development.

Q Under your leadership and guidance, OFID has worked with many organizations that have similar objectives. How valuable has this been throughout the years?

A It's impossible to overestimate the importance of working with other DFIs. OFID has joined forces with many partners, including the World Bank Group, regional development banks such as the Asia Development Bank, the African Development Bank and the Inter-American Development Bank. We have also signed and renewed MoUs with various institutions over the last few years.

But our belief in the importance of cooperation goes way back. OFID played a significant role in the establishment of the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), for example, to mobilize resources for agricultural development

in the poorer regions of the world. We channeled US\$861.1 million in contributions from OPEC Member Countries towards the agency's initial capital and first replenishment. Since IFAD's creation, OPEC Member States have maintained their support, contributing to additional replenishments of its resources. OFID has also given a further US\$20 million as a special contribution from its own resources.

Q Would it be safe to assume that some funded projects have not performed as you had planned or hoped? If so, what are the reasons and how does OFID navigate the challenges to ensure optimal results?

A Not surprisingly, all of OFID's projects begin with clear and specific objectives and targeted returns. To safeguard these goals and the interests of our Partner Countries and beneficiaries, we focus on key critical success factors. This is one of the most important aspects of OFID's day-to-day work: to ensure that we follow-up on our operations (please also see my answer to question 3).

priorities and, of course, the development projects they want OFID to support. We encourage community consultation and participation, and review project design thoroughly. We also consult with experienced co-financiers and experts, and our vast experience is very important in predicting outcomes. We carefully quantify project risks and adhere to strict standards to ensure each project is justifiable from an economic, technical, social and financial standpoint. We also give due consideration to environmental impact and management considerations. During project implementation, OFID remains in constant communication with project implementation units for monitoring and supervisory purposes. We provide encouragement and guidance, ensuring procedures are adhered to. In short, we provide the necessary conditions for our projects to be implemented efficiently to maximize the impact of our financing.

Finally, after completion, OFID receives feedback in the form of a Project Completion Report, which focuses on any lessons learned to improve the implementation of future projects.

OFID enjoys a high level of repayments through all its financing mechanisms. Non-performing loans are less than 3 percent of the outstanding, meaning the repayment rate of loans through disbursement is 97 percent.

Q What is the impact of declining oil prices on OFID's capacity for project funding?

A OFID's operations are entirely independent of oil price volatility.

Q How does OFID help alleviate the suffering of refugees, especially in the Middle East?

A OFID dedicated the whole of 2016 − our 40th anniversary
 − to raising awareness of the plight of refugees, worldwide.

The organization works hard to keep migration and all its related issues in the international spotlight.

Our Special Grants Program for Palestine is a permanent agenda item for our Governing Board. Palestine has received more grant assistance from OFID – on a cumulative basis – than any other country. We have, for example, supported the Al-Quds University in Palestine, which provides for the higher education needs of the Palestinians, since 1998.

In 2014, following a personal invitation from Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas, I led OFID's first mission to Palestine. The mission provided a valuable opportunity to better understand the complicated situation on the ground. Several grant agreements were signed with both new and long-established partners.

We are planning another OFID mission to the West Bank. It will include several high-level meetings with partner agencies and a number of grant agreements will be signed. We also aim to make field visits to some of OFID's flagship projects, and visits will include inauguration ceremonies of new health, education and energy facilities. A meeting with President Abbas—to brief him on the mission's key events and on new commitments—is also planned.

Earlier this year, OFID approved two emergency aid grants to help meet the health and food needs of approximately 67,000 people in Syria and Yemen. The funds will support activities being carried by the IFRC – the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (Syria) and the ICRC – the International Committee of the Red Cross (Yemen).

But these are merely recent examples. OFID has worked with the United Nations Relief and Work Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, for example, since 1979, and we first began supporting the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies in 1997.

Q You are now a successful Managing Director and main shareholder of "Eastmed", with an outstanding track record in the shipping community and an excellent reputation that is consistently growing. Would you share with us the company's future plans, goals and objectives?

A The objective of "Eastmed" is to operate a versatile medium size fleet of ocean going commercial carriers as above, giving quality service to our clients with a loyal and motivated staff.

A One of the objectives of today's shipping companies is to protect the sea environment, to contribute in maintaining clean seas.

To be cost competitive we have to economize on fuel consumed, which is our highest cost category.

For business continuity purposes, we have to renew our fleets with technologically advanced eco ships.

Q Mr. Martinos, you are ambitious, inventive and face the future with passion and deep enthusiasm for

new challenges ahead. In your opinion, how would the future maritime industry be affected, should new trade routes be opened, e.g., revival and reconstruction of the ancient "Silk Route" or the routes from the North Pole via "Transpolar Sea Route" ("Northeast Passage" and "Northwest Passage") which will bypass some key straits?

A The 'Silk Route' promoted by China is mostly overland, although the Chinese use big containerships for their exports from China to Europe. The 'North Sea Passage' will be used mostly by large Gaz carriers to connect the Eastern Siberia gaz fields with North Europe. Presently it is too costly to build commercial ships for this route.

A Since 2009 we are in a period of rather depressed/low freight rates for Tankers and Dry Bulk vessels. Most Greek shipping companies, including ourselves, took advantage of the low values to renew their fleet with eco ships.

However, profitability of the Greek merchant shipping is still low.

There were not many Greek shipping companies' failures due to a conservative policy of low indebtedness.

The above applies to "Eastmed", as well as others.

Q Taking it the other way around, how far do you think that the Greek maritime sector has contributed to overcoming the Greek crisis and what measures should the Greek Government consider to enhance the role of the Greek maritime industry as one the most important pillars of the Greek economy?

A The Greek maritime sector has contributed to the Greek economy during the crisis years of 2009/2017

although shipping was also in depression (less so than the Greek economy), as follows:

- (a) Maintaining full employment of available Greek crew; i.e. no contribution to Greece's high unemployment figures.
- (b) Hiring an increasing number of young Greek cadets.
- (c) Increasing the employment number of Greek shipping operations shore staff.
- (d) Increasing the annual tonnage tax and the special taxes to some €300 million.
- (e) Through the big shipping foundations (Niarchos, Onassis, others) making available vast sums of money for health, educational and welfare purposes.

The Greek governments have always supported the shipping sector and there is a good and close cooperation between our Union of Shipowners and the Greek authorities.

The only challenge comes from the European Union Competition Commissioner Mrs. Vestager, but hopefully a solution will soon be found.





DEL MONTE HELLAS S.A. is located to a total area of 121.000m2 with main production as per below:

- Canned fruits & tomatoes (peaches, fruit cocktail, tomato paste, chopped tomatoes and prunes)
- Plastic pots (fruitini, fruit express and vegetables)
- Flexible bags (Chopped tomatoes, pizza sauce and tomato paste)
- Aseptic drum (peach concentrate and tomato concentrate)

Raw peaches are harvested from mid-July to mid-September while raw pears from mid-August to end September. Daily throughput on peaches is 560t and for the pears 88t.

Product is stored brite and then labelled against actual orders. Warehouse capacity is for 1.609.000 common cases. Last years it has established as biomass plant that uses peach pits directly out of the production process without drying for its needs. Other facilities referring to health and safety as per below:

- Offices: office building, to accommodate the Administration departments (543 square metres).
- Personnel Utilities: Shift reception area, changing rooms and complete rest rooms (489 square meters).
